N. WAYSTATION

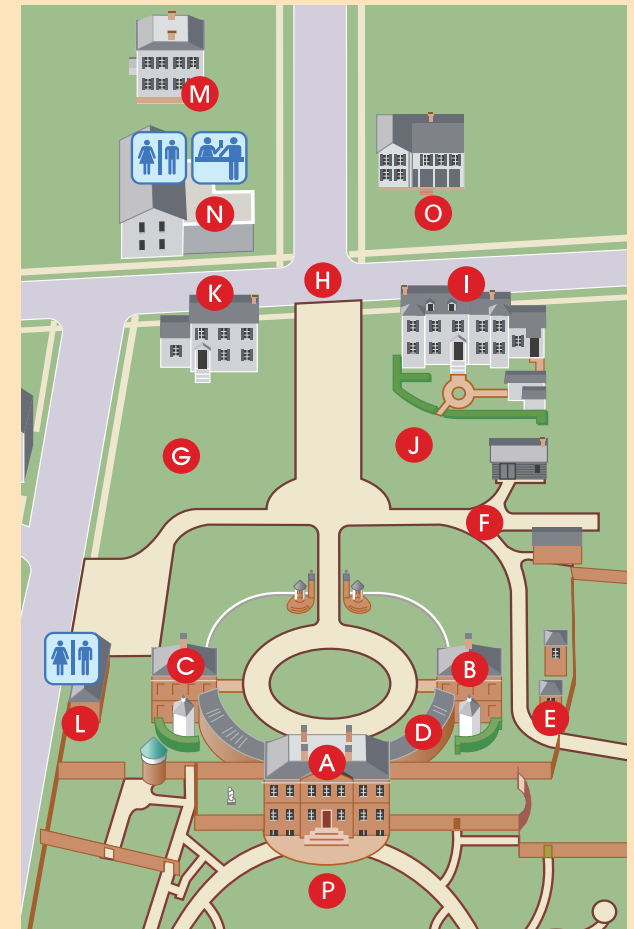
All ticketing, includes Will Call and general information. Restrooms also available. Tents outside the station will sell souvenirs, wreaths, hot cocoa, and coffee.
